## OUR SCHOOL

The ISF International School Frankfurt Rhein-Main – founded by the city of Frankfurt, the State of Hesse, and multi-national corporations in September 1995 – offers world-class education from Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 12/13. It is an independent, co-educational, whole-day school situated in the heart of the Rhein-Main region of Germany offering non-sectarian, English language instruction. According to the decree of the Hessian Ministry of Education and Cultural Affairs dated May 7, 1998, we are a state-approved supplementary school “staatlich anerkannte Ergänzungsschule” according to § 176 HSchG.

## OUR CURRICULUM

ISF offers a traditional core college preparatory curriculum. A third language is studied starting in Grade 6. Students who complete their secondary education at ISF have the following options of diplomas and/or external exams:

- ISF High School Diploma (upon the satisfactory completion of the graduation requirements – see below)
- IGCSE – The British International General Certificate of Secondary Education (at the end of Grade 10 or Grade 11)
- IB Diploma Programme – The International Baccalaureate Exam (at the end of Grade 12 or Grade 13). ISF has been an IB World School since August 2007.
- Advanced Placement – The American Advanced Placement exams (AP Capstone Diploma or individual AP exams at the end of Grade 12)
- A-Level – The British Advanced Level Exams (at the end of Grade 13) offered until school year 2008-2009

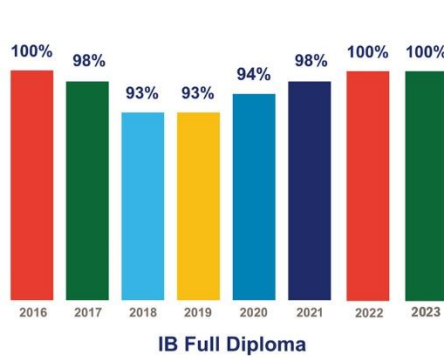

## OUR GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Graduation from ISF requires a minimum of 22 credits\* in Grades 9-12 as follows:

- 4 credits of English
- 4 credits of Mathematics
- 3 credits of Physical Sciences (General, Physics, Chemistry or Biology)
- 3 credits of Social Sciences (Social Studies, History, Geography, Economics, Business Studies, etc.)
- 3 credits of World Language (one of these must be German)
- 5 credits of Electives

\* 1 credit = passing a year-long course which meets 3 or more times a week  
0.5 credit = passing a year-long course which meets once or twice a week

Mandatory courses in Grade 9 (at ISF):

Art or Music, Physical Education, Computer Science, Advising/Health
